Lesser Canada Goose, Snow Goose and Ruddy Shelduck are mostly recorded as feral or escaped individuals. Genuine vagrants are rare nationally. If you really suspect that you have a vagrant, a description will be required to be forwarded to the BBRC. Otherwise, descriptions for these species are not required.

Descriptions may also be required for migrants occurring out of season (March Lesser Whitethroats and November Willow Warblers are about as frequent as Pallas's Warblers!) or of birds otherwise out of context (e.g. Red Grouse in Birkenhead Docks!).
